## Proposal:

### • Structure

- 1. Semester long course
- 2. Class size capped at 10 students
- 3. Begin with SLD reading students
- 4. Promote positive learning environment
- 5. Create cooperative learning
- 6. Develop metacognitive skills applicable across all content areas
- 7. Progress monitoring by students and teacher
- Instruction: Differentiated, Multi-faceted, Individualized, Data driven
  - 1. Decoding/Word Recognition
  - 2. Fluency
  - 3. Vocabulary
  - 4. Comprehension
  - 5. Writing
